

INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF  
THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,  
T. 40 N., R. 19 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

From this corner, the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 32, T. 41 N., R. 19 E., hereinbefore described, bears S.  $89^{\circ} 58'$  W., 1.84 chs. dist.

Point for the N  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6, established at 40.00 chs. in latitude from the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6 and on the Eighth Standard Parallel North.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this corner, the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31, T. 41 N., R. 19 E., hereinbefore described, bears WEST, 1.79 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 40 North, Range 19 East, ranges from about 5,600 to 7,000 ft. above sea level, and is gently rolling to mountainous. The soil varies from sandy clay to rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, bunchgrass and native grass. There are scattered juniper in the south and west portion of the township.

Boulder Lake sets in sections 10 and 15, and Boulder Creek, flows northwesterly through the township, draining into Boulder Lake.

Home Camp Ranch House, is located in section 27.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by numerous improved and unimproved desert trail roads.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
