40.00	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
