Add the marks to read as follows.

The standard closing cor. of Tps. 35 and 36 N., Rs. 50 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the Seventh Standard Parallel North, through Range 50 East, executed under Group No. 27. Add the marks 1986 to the brass cap.

From this corner, the angle point bet. secs. 1 and 6, Tps. 35 N., Rs. 50 and 51 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, showing 12 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the W. bdy. of T. 35 N., R. 51 E., executed under Group No. 27, bears S.  $1^{\circ} 00'$  W., 12.70 lks. dist.

The standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 49 and 50 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set showing 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 50 E., executed under Group No. 27.

N.  $0^{\circ} 04'$  E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling to mountainous land, covered with sagebrush and native grass.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground. This monument is accepted as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner, with brass cap mkd.
