The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with an unmarked volcanic stone, 14X8X6 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone. This unmarked stone correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.
