

SURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISION OF SECTION 12,
T. 22 N., R. 47 E., MDM, NEVADACHAINS

Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush and bunchgrass.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 22 N., R. 47 E., executed under Group No. 598.

This corner is located at a fence corner, from which fences under construction bear E. and S.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area surveyed within section 12, Township 22 North, Range 47 East, is nearly level in the west and mountainous in the eastern portion. The elevation ranges from 5,800 to 6,680 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam in the valley to rocky in the mountains. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass and juniper trees in the mountains.

There is a log cabin, trailer house and barn in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 12 and Twin Springs and a water tank are located in the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 12.

The area is used for grazing cattle by ranchers.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
