N. 1° 25' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36. Over mountainous land, covered with scattered juniper, sagebrush and native grass. Point for the  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at 39.12 proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
