40.00	<p>Point for the <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2<math>\frac{1}{2}</math> ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T43N R19E <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 35   S 36</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1985</p>
