GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the confines of this survey in Township 43 North, Range 20 East, located on the eastern side of Long Valley, ranges from approximately 5,500 to 6,000 ft. above sea level and is generally level on the west boundary, rising gently to a distinct bluff toward the east, with tableland and gently rolling land on top. The soil is sandy in the valley becoming very rocky on the bluff and on top. The vegetation consists of scattered juniper in areas on top and scattered sagebrush and native grass throughout.

Access is gained to this area via County Road 8A, an east-west road located about a mile south of the township. There is a main trail road in township running generally northwest and southeast in addition to a couple of other minor trail roads. There is a reservoir located in section 34 and numerous windmills. The western part of West Lake extends into sections 25 and 36.

Principal users of the area are ranchers and hunters.
