

TOWNSHIP 44 NORTH, RANGE 19 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>The land within Township 44 North, Range 19 East, located in Long Valley, ranges from 5,500 to 6,500 ft. above sea level, encompassing the northern end of Alkali Lake, rising to a north-south mountain range along the western tier of sections. The soil is sandy clay loam mixed with varying amounts of alkali at the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of scattered sagebrush, rabbitbrush, buckbrush and native grass, with pockets of juniper, aspen and mountain mahogany at the upper elevations.</p> <p>Access is gained to this area via an improved gravel road which runs along the fourth meridional for $4\frac{3}{4}$ miles, south to north, jogs approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the east, then turns easterly along the north boundary of the township, leaving in section 3. A trail road commences at this point, extending easterly to eventually join with Nevada State Highway No. 34 a few miles to the east of this township. There are several trail roads in the area. Improvements in the area include two main ranches and a couple of mobile homes. There is also a major high voltage transmission line that traverses the eastern part of the township.</p> <p>Principal users are ranchers and hunters.</p>
