Baker Mine lode and point of beginning.</div><div>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</div><div>The area resurveyd within Township 19 North, Range 44 East is situated at the northern portion of the Toiyabe Range. The township is mostly mountainous terrain and the elevation ranges from about 6,500 to 8,100 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay loam and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, juniper and pinion pine.</div><div>The western portion of the township is drained by Marshall Canyon, Pony Canyon and Midas Canyon, which drain in a westerly direction into Reese River Valley.</div><div>U.S. Highway No. 50 enters the township in sec. 19 and follows Pony Canyon up to Austin Summitt in sec. 28. Further access into the township is provided by numerous unimproved roads connecting with this main highway.</div><div>All of the western portion of the township is highly mineralized and has numerous mining claims.</div><div>The town of Austin, Nevada is located in sec. 19.</div></div>
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
