Over nearly level land, through scattered sagebrush, rabbitbrush and native grass.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with an unmarked trapstone, 8X7X6 ins., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground, in a fence, bearing E. and W.
