From the standard cor. of Tps. 46 N., Rs. 19 and 20 E.
N. 0° 06' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush and bunchgrass.

27.30 Spur, projects NE.

37.20 Ravine, drains E.

40.22 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with an unmarked trapstone, 24X8X4 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone. This unmarked trapstone correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the unmarked trapstone and set a steel fence post, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the iron post.

40.08 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with a trapstone, 30X12X3 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone and plainly mkd. with 1 groove on S. face and 5 grooves on N. face.
