

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY,
T. 46 N., R. 19 E., MDM. NEVADA

CHAINS

A juniper, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 69° W., 43 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on open blaze. (Record bearing, N. 60° W.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the decayed remains of the original wooden post alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 06' E., beginning new measurement.

Over mountainous land.

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, monumented with a trapstone, 22X20X8 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone and plainly mkd. with 5 grooves on S. face and 1 groove on N. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the original cornerstone alongside the iron post and rebuild the mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

N. 0° 20' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush, bunchgrass and medium juniper.
