GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 46 North, Range 19 East, ranges from about 5,700 to 7,000 ft. above sea level, and is mostly mountainous. The soil varies from sandy clay to gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush and bunchgrass.

There are scattered juniper, mountain mahogany and aspen throughout the area.

The township is drained by Little Coleman Canyon, which drains northeast through the northeast portion of the township and numerous other washes throughout the area.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved gravel and dirt roads.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
