

TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 68 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The geographic position for the closing cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 68 E. is at latitude $41^{\circ} 07' 35.9''$ N. and longitude $114^{\circ} 13' 01.1''$ W., as calculated along section lines from a closed traverse tie to U.S.G.S. Bench Mark and triangulation station "4864 (BM 260)" located in sec. 14, T. 37 N., R. 69 E., executed under Group No. 611.

The mean magnetic declination was found to be 16° E.

monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly
set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap
mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent
resurvey of T. 39 N., R. 68 E., executed under Group
No. 582.

S. $89^{\circ} 55'$ E., along the S. bdy. of sec. 31.

Over mountainous land, covered with medium pinon pine,
juniper, scattered sagebrush, buckbrush, cacti and
native grass.

monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly
set in a mound of stone, with aluminum cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey

aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of

executed under Group No. 582.
