CHAINS	From this same corner, the original closing cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 68 E., monumented with a wooden post, 3 ins. square, 32 ins. long, wired to a steel fence post, firmly set 16 ins. in the ground and dimly mkd. with illegible scribe marks, bears N. 87° 29' E., 0.34 chs. dist. This point now becomes an amended monument. Scribe the marks "AM" on the wooden post and bury the original wooden post alongside the steel fence post.

	From the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set showing 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 37 N., R. 67 E., executed under Group No. 26.	
	S. 89° 38' E., bet. secs. 6 and 31.	
	Over rolling mountainous land, covered with medium juniper, sagebrush, scattered pinon pine and native grass.	
	16.00	Spur, slopes NNE.
	30.80	Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains N.
	38.20	Ridge, bears N. and S.
	40.25	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

	Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.
