<p>CHAINS</p> <p>7.00</p> <p>14.89</p> <p>40.50</p> <p>81.00</p>	<p>N. 1° 46' E., along the W. bdy. of sec. 6.</p> <p>Over gently rolling land, through scattered sagebrush, greasewood and native grass.</p> <p>Charley Creek, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course ESE.</p> <p>The closing cor. of secs. 1 and 12, T. 39 N., R. 68 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 39 N., R. 68 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.</p> <p>Point for the W ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T39N R68E R69E ¼ S 6 1986</p> <p>Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <p>The cor. of Tps. 39 and 40 N., Rs. 69 E., monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, loosely set in a mound of earth, with illegible scribe marks visible.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> T40N R69E T39N S 31 S 1 S 6 R68E T39N 1986</p> <p>Reset the decayed remains of the original wooden post and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY, T. 39 N., R. 69 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by J.C.
