Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
J. C. Smyles and C. S. Preble, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,  
in 1881.

The standard cor. of Tps. 41 N., Rs. 69 and 70 E.,  
monumented with a decayed wooden post, 2 ins. square,  
14 ins. long, loosely set in a mound of earth, with  
illegible scribe marks visible.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins.  
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the original wooden post and set a steel fence  
post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.

S. 89° 22' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over gently rolling land, covered with medium  
sagebrush, scattered rabbitbrush and native grass.

4.70 Abandoned trail road, bears irregularly N. and S.

11.20 Bladed road, bears irregularly SSW. and NNE.

39.61 Point for the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, at  
proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence  
of the original corner.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins.  
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
