<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area surveyed within Township 12 North, Range 68 East, is steep rocky mountainous terrain including Highland Ridge and the western slope of the Snake Mountain Range. The elevation ranges from about 8,000 to 12,000 ft. above sea level.</p> <p>The area is drained by numerous creeks and small streams which flow westerly into Spring Valley.</p> <p>The soil is composed of rocky and clay loam. This supports a medium to heavy growth of timber which consists of mountain mahogany, aspen, subalpine and Douglas fir, limber pine, bristlecone pine and spruce. The undergrowth consists of ceanothus, Brigham tea, buckbrush, chokecherry, rosebush, serviceberry, sagebrush and native grass.</p> <p>Mining activity was present in sections 11, 14, 15, 22 and 23. No other mining deposits of value were noted.</p>
