81.61	<p>Intersect the N. bdy. of sec. 4, T. 12 N., R. 68 E.</p> <p>Point for the closing corner of secs. 33 and 34.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T13N R68E C C S 33 S 34 S 4 T12N R68E 1987</p> <p>Set a fiberglass post, 6 ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <p>From this corner, the true point for the cor. of secs. 3 and 4, on the N. bdy. of T. 12 N., R. 68 E., as described in the field notes of T. 12 N., R. 68 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears EAST, 2.02 chs. dist.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky. Undergrowth, ceanothus, wild rosebush and native grass.
