Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.

From this corner, the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 41 N., R. 70 E., hereinbefore described, bears N. 89° 33' E., 17.38 chs. dist.

Point for the N ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 6 is on the Eighth Standard Parallel North and at proportionate distance on the N. bdy. of sec. 6.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

From this corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 41 N., Rs. 69 and 70 E., hereinbefore described, bears N. 89° 22' E., 16.48 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 40 North, Range 70 East is situated in Tecoma Valley about 6 miles NNE. of Montello, Nevada. The elevation ranges from about 4,800 to 5,200 ft. above sea level, and is mostly rolling. The soil varies from sandy clay to gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbit brush, greasewood, crested wheatgrass and native grass.

The township is drained by Loray Wash, which drains northeasterly through the township and numerous other dry washes throughout the area.

Dake Reservoir is situated in sections 7, 18 and 19, and there is a cemetery in section 32.

The Southern Pacific Railroad crosses northeasterly through the township. Nevada State Highway No. 233, roughly parallels the railroad. Further access to the township is provided by numerous secondary and desert trail roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
