N. 0° 31' E., along the W. bdy. of sec. 31.

Over nearly level bottom land.

15.00 Leave bottom land, bears NNW. and SSE., over rolling
land, through scattered sagebrush and native grass.

39.58 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, monumented with a wooden
post, 2 ins. square, 30 ins. long, with illegible
scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins.
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
