CHAINS	
	N. 88° 24' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.
	Over rolling land, through pasture.
5.10	Fence, bears N. and S.; enter scattered sagebrush, shadscale and native grass.
6.80	Trail road, bears irregularly N. and S.
10.40	Power and telephone line, bears N. 2½° W. and S. 2½° E.
27.70	Nevada State Highway No. 893, paved, on curve, bears N. and S.
34.30	Improved gravel road, bears NNW. and SSE.
40.43	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, wired to an iron rebar, 3/8 in. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground.
	At the corner point
	Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

39.93	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
