J. Hatch, J. H. Eaton and J. C. Smyles, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1872, and a Portion of the Resurvey Executed by W. T. Moran, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1890.</p> <hr/> <p>The cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, on the east bdy. of the Tp., monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, with illegible scribe marks visible, firmly set alongside a steel fence post, exposed 24 ins. above ground, at the corner of fences bearing S. and E.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> $\begin{array}{r} \text{T30N} \\ \text{R56E R57E} \\ \text{S } 13 \text{S } 18 \\ \hline \text{S } 24 \text{S } 19 \end{array}$ <p>1987</p> <p>Reset the original wooden post and steel fence post alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <p>N. 0° 13' W., bet. secs. 13 and 18.</p> <p>Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush, rabbit brush and native grass.</p> <p>40.43 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 18, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p>
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
