CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 30 North, Range 56 East, ranges from about 5400 to 5900 ft. above sea level, and is mostly rolling. The soil varies from sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbit brush, greasewood, crested wheat grass and native grass.

The township is drained by Huntington Creek, which flows north-northwesterly through section 19, 30 and 31 and Cottonwood Creek and Smith Creek, which flows northwesterly through the township.

Access into the township is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 228, which crosses the area from N. to S. Further access to the township is provided by numerous secondary and desert trail roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
