

SURVEY OF A TRAVERSE OF THE SOUTH BANK OF SNAKE CREEK,
THROUGH SECTION 17,
TOWNSHIP 12 NORTH, RANGE 70 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

Over rolling land, along Snake Creek.

The witness point bet. secs. 16 and 17, hereinbefore described.

From this corner, the witness corner for secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, hereinbefore described, bears N. 0° 03' W., 5.90 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area surveyed and resurveyed within Township 12 North, Range 70 East, ranges from about 6,200 to 7,000 ft. above sea level, and is mostly mountainous to rolling. The soil consists of sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the lower elevations. Vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush and native grass with tick rosebush along Snake Creek. There are stands of juniper and pinon pine throughout the township with some cottonwood along the creek bottom.

The area is drained by Snake Creek, which flows easterly.

Access into the area is provided by an improved gravel road.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen.

There were no mineral formations of consequence noted during the survey.
