	Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.
	From this corner, U.S.G.S. Bench Mark, monumented with a standard brass tablet, firmly set in concrete with brass tablet stamped 19 LRC 1971 , bears N. 86° 32' E., 10.22 chs. dist.
44.20	Improved gravel road, bears NW. and SE.
50.20	Ravine, drains NW.
54.20	Old trail road, bears NW. and SE.
65.10	Trail road, bears NE. and SW.
80.72	The cor. of Tps. 33 and 34 N., Rs. 30 and 31 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 34 N., R. 31 E., executed under Group No. 14.
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	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The area resurveyed within Township 33 North, Range 30 East, ranges from mountainous in the southern portion to rolling in the northern portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,200 to 6,900 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky in the higher elevations to sandy clay loam in the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grass. There are heavy stands of juniper on the southern half of the township.
	Access into the area is provided by numerous desert trail roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.
	There is evidence of mining activity in the southern portion of the township.
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
