

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY,  
TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 55 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

A juniper, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 55° E., 52 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R55E S4 BT on partially healed blaze. (Record, S. 56° E., 54 lks.)

A juniper, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 39 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° W., 58 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R55E S5 BT on partially healed blaze. (Record S. 41° W.)

A pinon pine, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 81 lks. dist., mkd. T18S R55E S32 BT on partially healed blaze. (Record, N. 32 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 80 lks.)

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,  
T. 19 S., R. 55 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by T. Binge,  
U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1881.

From the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S., Rs. 55 and 56 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the resurvey of T. 19 S., R. 56 E., executed under Group No. 147, from which the bearing trees mkd. in 1929.

A juniper, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 10° E., 109 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R56E S31 BT on partially healed blaze. (Record, 107 lks.)

A stump hole, bears S. 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 86 lks. dist., with a down pinon pine alongside, 10 ins. diam., mkd. T20S R56E S6 BT on open blaze.

A pinon pine snag, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 78 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 34 lks. dist., mkd. T20S R55E S1 BT on open blaze.

A mahogany snag, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 87 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° W., 41 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R55E S36 BT on open blaze.

No other suitable bearing trees available within limits.

N. 88° 54' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through pine, juniper and mahogany.
