	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within the confines of this survey in Township 30 North, Range 55 East, located just west of Jiggs, Nevada, ranges from 5,300 to 7,100 ft. above sea level and is mostly rolling in the eastern part rising to Cedar Ridge, a north-south mountain range, in the western part. The soil is sandy, clay loam at the lower elevations, becoming rocky at the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of medium to heavy densities of juniper along Cedar Ridge with small patches of pinon pine in the northwestern part and scattered sagebrush, rabbitbrush and native grass and sparse cactus throughout. There is a large area of reseeded land in the southeast part.</p> <p>There is no indication of springs anywhere in the township and water is attained for cattle by three wells in the area and by Huntington Creek, which flows northerly along the eastern boundary of the township.</p> <p>Access is gained into this area from the north via Twin Bridges or from the east via Jiggs. There are several trail roads in the vicinity.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are ranchers.</p>
