From this same corner, the N  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 12, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the subdivisional lines of T. 17 S., R. 64 E., executed under Group 237, bears NORTH, 5.46 chs. dist. Hereafter, this cor. will function as an amended monument.

Add the marks "AM 1987" to the brass cap.

The standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 35, T. 16 S., R. 64 E., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the Fourth Standard Parallel South, through Range 64 East, executed under Group No. 237, bears WEST, 14.155 chs. dist. Hereafter, this cor. will function as an amended monument.

Add the marks "AM 1987" to the brass cap.

From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the subdivisional lines of T. 17 S., R. 64 E., executed under Group No. 237. Remark the brass cap to read as follows:

Over rolling land, covered with scattered chaparral, creosote and cacti.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
