Deputy Surveyor, in 1868.</p> <hr/> <p>From the cor. of Tps. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 27 and 28 E. N. 0°11' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36. Over rolling terrain, sagebrush and sand.</p> <p>32.80 Top of small clay knoll.</p> <p>40.11 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a basalt stone, 8X8X3 ins., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, no visible marks.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T17N R27E R28E ¼ S 36   S 31  1990</p> <p>Bury the original cornerstone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 0°28' E., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>2.25 Ravine, drains NE.</p> <p>4.80 Ridge, bears E. and W.</p> <p>19.45 Ravine, drains NE.</p>
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
