From the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 22 and 21, monumented with a basalt stone, 14X12X6 ins., loosely set, lying on the ground, mkd. 3 grooves on S. face and 3 grooves on the E. face. This monument correlates well with other original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the original cor. position. (Record: wooden post.)

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the mkd. stone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.
