Reestablishment of the Survey Executed  
by E. B. Monroe and A. G. Bateman,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1874  
and the Survey and Resurvey Executed  
by R. W. Reilly and T. A. Magee,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1881.

From the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 22 and 21, monumented  
with a basalt stone, 14X12X6 ins., loosely set, lying  
on the ground, mkd. 3 grooves on S. face and 3 grooves  
on the E. face. This monument correlates well with  
other original corners and is accepted as the best  
available evidence of the original cor. position.  
(Record: wooden post.)

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins.  
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the mkd. stone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft.  
long, alongside the stainless steel post.

N. 0°14' E., bet. secs. 15 and 16.

Over sand dunes and hillocks.
