39.80	<p>The cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 33 E., and Tps. 34 and 34$\frac{1}{2}$ N., Rs. 32 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, exposed 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 34 N., R. 33 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.</p> <p>N. 87° 32' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.</p> <p>Over level land, through scattered greasewood.</p> <p>Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Hereafter this corner will refer to Tps. 34 and 34$\frac{1}{2}$ N., Rs. 32 E. only.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p>
