12.45	<p>The closing cor. of Tps. 34 N., Rs. 33½ and 34 E., hereinafter described.</p>
19.31	<p>The closing cor. of T. 35 N., R. 33 E. and T. 34 N., R. 33½ E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, exposed 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 35 N., R. 33 E., executed under Group No. 656.</p>
41.27	<p>Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Hereafter this corner will refer to sec. 31 only.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> T35N R34E ¼ S 31 T34N R33E </p> <p style="text-align: center;">1988</p> <p>Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p>
