RLS 6197 CALDWELL, firmly set flush with the ground, alongside the steel fence post.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T35N R34E R35E S 11 S 6 <hr/>S 12 S 7</p> <p>1988</p> </div> <p>Insert the iron rebar inside the stainless steel post and reset the original redwood post and steel fence post, alongside the stainless steel post.</p>
