9.40	Wash, 25 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains irregularly NW.
41.16	<p>The W $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with a redwood post, 1$\frac{1}{2}$X3X12 ins. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth. This corner now becomes an amended monument.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a copper-coated steel stake, 21 ins. long, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., 19 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">BLM AM</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1988</p> <p>Reset the original wooden post alongside the copper-coated steel stake.</p> <hr style="width: 20%; margin: 10px auto;"/> <p>N. 2° 02' W., across sec. 1, T. 35 N., R. 33 E., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Over nearly level land.</p>
14.00	Western Pacific Railroad track, bears N. 79 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. and S. 79 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.
14.70	Communication line, parallels railroad track.
15.60	Buried U.S. Telecom telecommunication line, parallels railroad track.
17.10	Jungo Road, improved gravel, parallels railroad track.
20.60	Buried AT&T telecommunication line, parallels railroad track.
23.12	<p>Intersect the N. bdy. of sec. 1, T. 35 N., R. 33 E.</p> <p>Point for the southeast closing cor. of Tp. 35$\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 33 E.</p>
