This corner is located 2 lks. S. of a fence; fence, bears E. and W.

From this corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 33 and 34 E., hereinbefore described, bears S. 89° 43' W., 6.57 chs. dist.

From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 0° 08' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over mountainous land, covered with scattered sagebrush, shadscale, native grass and juniper.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with a redwood post, 2 ins. square, 21 ins. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
