From this same corner, the amended monument for the W $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, hereinbefore described, bears S. 89° 05' W.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, L. H. Taylor in 1898.

From Cor. No. 1, Mineral Survey No. 1845, Golden Eagle lode, monumented with a juniper post, 2 ins. square, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, loosely set in a mound of stone. This point correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.
