	<p>Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by A. J. Hatch and J. H. Eaton, U.S. Deputy Surveyors in 1871, and of a Portion of the Resurvey Executed by U.S. Surveyor S. P. Stewart and U.S. Transitmen R. W. Riley and J. C. Clark in 1914-1918.</p>
	<p>From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set exposed 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 34 N., R. 51 E., executed under Group No. 27. Remark the brass cap to read as follows:</p>

	<p>N. 0° 27' E., bet. secs. 25 and 26.</p>
	<p>Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush and native grass.</p>
12.80	<p>Ridge, bears NW. and SE.</p>
40.21	<p>Point for the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, at proportionate distance. The 1914 iron post was found approximately 3 chs. SE., lying under a rock overhang. There was no evidence of it ever being set.</p>
	<p>Set the iron post, 36 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., on solid rock over a cross (X), in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p>
