TOWNSHIP 25 NORTH, RANGE 36 EAST, MDM, NEVADA CHAINS GENERAL DESCRIPTION The area resurveyed within T. 25 N., R. 36 E., is mountainous with some mesas between ridges. The elevation ranges from 4,000 to 7,200 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam on the mesas and along creek bottoms to gravel and rocks. vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, shadscale, rabbitbrush, bitterbrush, Brigham tea and native grass. The trees that are to be found are pinion pine and junipers in the mountains with some cottonwoods and willows in the canyons that have water. The township is drained mostly by Cottonwood Creek which enters the township between secs. 31 and 36 on the west boundary, flows generally east and exits between secs. 35 and 2 on the south boundary. Access is limited to a few trail roads. There are numerous remains of stone and wood buildings to be found in Cottonwood Canyon. There is extensive prospecting activity in the mountains. Springs are found throughout the township.
