	<hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The portion of Township 21 South, Range 59 East that was resurveyed is mountainous. The land is predominately rocky with the soil consisting mostly of sand. The elevation ranges from about 3,000 to 5,000 feet above sea level. The vegetation consists of yucca, Joshua trees, other numerous different cacti, bitterbrush, creosote brush, Brigham tea and native grass.</p> <p>Access is limited to a few rough trail roads and one improved gravel road into the Blue Diamond Mine that has a locked gate on it. The principal user of the area is the Blue Diamond Mine which mines gypsum.</p> <hr/>
