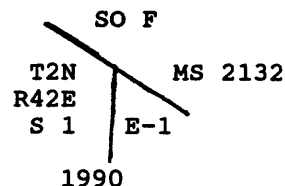

Elwood and Molly Gibson lodes

Cor. No. 1 of M. S. No. 2132, Elwood lode, on line 3-4, M. S. No. 2132, Southern Fraction lode, monumented with a wooden post, 4 ins. square, 48 ins. long, in an embedded mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high. This corner is so near record position in relation to Cor. No. 2 of M. S. No. 2132, Elwood lode and in agreement with the 1903 record bearing and distance to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., that it is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.



Reset the wooden post alongside the stainless steel post.

From this corner, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., bears N. 11°41' W., 9.935 chs. dist.

Thence S. 2°51' W., on line 1-2, Elwood lode.
