

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY,
T. 19 N., R. 31 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

CHAINS

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Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
E. B. Monroe, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1868.

The cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E., rehabilitated by G. L. Ducret, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in 1950, monumented with a cylindrical concrete monument, 18 ins. long, 3 ins. diam., firmly set showing 4 ins. above ground, with top broken and cap missing, and a broken basalt stone, 12X8X5 ins., lying loose nearby, plainly mkd. with 6 grooves on N., S., E. and W. faces and 20N on N. face and 32E on E. face. This cor. will now refer to the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 N., Rs. 31 E. only.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the original cornerstone and concrete monument and set a fiberglass post, 5 ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.

From this corner, a fence corner bears N. 45° W., 0.05 chs. dist., from which fences bear N. and W.

N. $89^\circ 53'$ W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, covered with scattered sagebrush and native grass.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, rehabilitated by G. L. Ducret, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in 1950, monumented with a galvanized pipe, 48 ins. long, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set showing 24 ins. above ground and a $\frac{3}{8}$ in. rebar inside the pipe with 2 in. aluminum cap mkd. 5005 and a basalt stone 10X8X6 ins., lying loose nearby, dimly mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which the 1950 accessories:

A wood post, 4 ins. square, firmly set showing 24 ins., bears EAST, 15 lks. dist.

A wood post, 4 ins. square, firmly set showing 24 ins., bears WEST, 15 lks. dist.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.
