Add the marks T45N T44N R30E 1991 to the brass cap.</p> <hr/> <p>S. 89°52' W., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Over mountainous land.</p>
<p>39.99</p>	<p>The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 10 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the survey of T. 44 N., R. 30 E., executed under Group No. 62. <p>40.22</p>	<p>The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with an iron post, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes in connection with the dependent resurvey of T. 44 N., R. 31 E., executed under Group No. 399. Add the marks 1991 to the brass cap.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 0°05' E., beginning new measurements.</p> <p>Over rolling land.</p>
<p>18.60</p>	<p>Trail road, bears E. and W.</p>
<p>39.93</p>	<p>Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.</p>
