

SURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 13 N., R. 46 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

CHAINS

From the true corner point, the E $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 13, T. 13 N., R. 45 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the survey of T. 13 N., R. 45 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears NORTH, 9.930 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land encompassed in this survey is located about twenty-five miles north of the old mining town of Belmont, Nevada in Nye County.

The land is drained by East Northumberland Canyon, Wood Canyon and Water Canyon which drain southeasterly into Monitor Valley.

The land located within the Toquima Range varies in elevation from 8,200 ft. above sea level near the SW. cor. of the Tp. to 9,200 ft. above sea level in secs. 18 and 19.

The soil is composed of rocky and clay loam at the higher elevations. The timber consists of pinion pine, juniper and mountain mahogany. The undergrowth consists of sagebrush and native grass.

Access into this area is provided with improved roads from Smokey and Monitor Valleys and numerous trail roads branching from them.

There are some mineral deposits and mining activity in the secs. surveyed.
