

RETRACEMENT OF A PORTION OF THE CALIFORNIA-NEVADA  
STATE LINE, FROM MILEPOST 186 TO MILEPOST 191,  
T. 16 N., R. 18 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA AND CALIFORNIA

Chains

From this point, the remains of a pine snag, 24 ins. diam., laying partially buried in sand and brush on north shore of Lake Tahoe, bears South, 3.50 chs. dist., no marks visible that would verify it as the record line tree.

From this point, the U.S.C. & G.S. Triangulation Station "STATELINE 1922", bears S. 55°58'00" E., 18.866 chs. dist., monumented with a standard brass tablet, 3 1/2 ins. diam., cemented in top of boulder, mkd. and referenced as published, from which the brass tablet reference marks set in large boulders

Reference Monument No. 1, bears N. 83°45' E., 44.7 lks. dist.

Reference Monument No. 2, bears N. 67°15' W., 74.0 lks. dist.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF PORTIONS OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY,  
T. 16 N., R. 18 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, CALIFORNIA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
P.C. Rector, in 1865, and Retracement by  
C.S. Swanholm, in 1943

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, monumented with an unrecorded local iron pipe, 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 1 in. above ground, with unmarked steel cap, 3 ins. diam., and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A decayed sawed pine stump, with bark ring 38 ins. diam., bears N. 29° E., 39.5 lks. dist., with ax marks recovered in remains, no scribe marks visible. (1865 Record, N. 35° E., 27 lks., 1943 Record, N. 35° E., 37 lks.)

No evidence of record SW bearing tree.
