

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,
T. 16 N., R. 17 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, CALIFORNIA

Chains

A stump hole, 2 ft. diam., bears S. 68° E., 22 lks. dist., with remains of fallen Jeffrey pine snag alongside, with chaining notch and illegible scribe marks visible on open blaze. (1865 and 1975 Records, S. 73° E.)

A Jeffrey pine, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 45° W., 39 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on open blaze. (1865 Record, S. 40 1/4° W., 47 lks., 1975 Record, 40 lks.)

A rotted fir stump, 64 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 83 lks. dist., with chaining notch and scribe marks BT visible on remains of blaze. (1865 and 1975 Records, N. 74° W., 81 lks.)

and the 1975 record bearing tree

A Jeffrey pine, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 16° W., 44.5 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 6° W., 45 lks.)

and a new accessory

A power pole, tagged No. 139775, bears N. 15 1/2° E., 174 lks. dist.

Add marks 1989 to brass cap.

From this point the NE face of water tank, 30 ft. diam., bears N. 43 1/2° E., 90.3 lks. dist.

N. 0°01'50" W., on the E bdy. of sec. 1, T. 16 N., R. 17 E.

- 2.793 The true point for the closing cor. of secs. 7 and 18 only, T. 16 N., R. 18 E., hereinafter described.
- 7.10 Road, unpaved bladed surface, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 20° E. and S. 20° W.
- 16.75 Road, unpaved bladed surface, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 10° E. and S. 17° W. in curve.
- 40.371 The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, T. 16 N., R. 17 E., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 1/2 ft. diam., with brass cap mkd. as described in the 1975 remonumentation record of T. 16 N., R. 17 E., alongside of which is a granite stone, 10 x 12 x 20 ins., mkd. 1/4, from which the remains of the original bearing trees
