

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE
RANGE LINE THROUGH THE WESTERLY TIER OF SECTIONS,
T. 16 N., R. 18 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, CALIFORNIA

Chains

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Butler Ives, in 1865

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Note: Attention is called to the "History of prior surveys", on pages 1 & 2 of these field notes, reference to the origin of this "range line", which was to function as an interim west boundary of the township. The corners established on this 1865 line controlled Brown's 1874 completion survey of that portion of the elongated westerly tier of sections that lay west of the new 1872 State Line (i.e. in California), and, therefore, controlled a portion of the lotting as shown on the plat approved January 29, 1875. The cors. are now redesignated as Angle Points.

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From the milepost (terminal) cor. established by Rector in 1865 on the line bet. secs. 6 and 31, Tps. 16 and 17 N., R. 18 E., monumented with a well embedded mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, with decayed remains of wood post in center, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A stump hole with fir bark ring, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 24 3/4° E., 127.5 lks. dist., no marks visible. (1865 Rector Record, N. 25° E., 129 lks., 1865 Ives Record, N. 25° E., 127 lks.)

A sawed fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 50 3/4° E., 94 lks. dist., with scribe marks R18E S6 visible on partially healed blaze. (1865 Rector Record, S. 57° E., 98 lks., 1865 Ives Record, S. 50° E., 97 lks.)

A red fir snag, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 26 1/4° W., 108.5 lks. dist., with scribe marks 16N R17 visible on partially healed blaze. (1865 Rector Record, S. 25° W., 109 lks., 1865 Ives Record, S. 25° W., 108 lks.)

A red fir snag, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 66 3/4° W., 99 lks. dist., with scribe marks T17N R17E S36 visible on partially healed blaze. (1865 Rector Record, N. 61° W., 94 lks., 1865 Ives Record, N. 65° W., 95 lks.)

This point now becomes an angle point on the N bdy. of the Tp.
