This point now becomes an angle point.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground with a magnet at base, and in a mound of stone, 3 1/2 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

From the original 1865 milepost bet. secs. 6 and 31, Tps. 16 and 17 N., R. 18 E., now designated as an angle point, hereinbefore described.

N. 89°52'00" E., bet. secs. 6 and 31, on the N bdy. of the Tp.

5.70 Ridge, bears S. 40° E. and N. 40° W.

26.65 Dry drainage, 2 1/2 lks. wide, drains S. 8° W.
